

JUNE 2, 2014 COUNCIL MEETING

City Council met in public session on June 2, 2014. Here are the highlights.

Minutes were approved for the May 1 executive session, May 5 regular, executive & work sessions and May 8 executive session.

STATUS REPORTS

- Appoint New Council Member and Oath of Office – Mayor Bill Duncan explained the actions that City Council has taken in addressing the council vacancy created with the passing of Stanley Castleman. Council voted to appoint Mr. Chris Epley. Mayor Duncan administered the Oath of Office.

STAFF REPORT

Leisure Services Department Update. Mrs. Carol Collins provided an update on parks and recreation programs and events.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

- City Manager Norbert Klopsch shared that the construction season has begun and encouraged everyone to be cautious of the roadway construction work. He reported that the City will be opening sealed bids on Thursday, June 5 for the 2014 Asphalt Pavement Maintenance Program. He shared that a group of 28-30 college students, cycling cross-country in support of cancer awareness, will be riding through Oakwood on June 11.

- Councilmember Chris Epley thanked Council for his appointment to Oakwood City Council and pledged to the citizens of Oakwood that he would listen, learn and contribute. He thanked his family for their support.

- Mayor Bill Duncan shared how Mr. Castleman was honored at the That Day in May parade. He congratulated William D. Lockwood on the occasion of his 80th birthday and proclaimed Friday, May 30, 2014 as William D. Lockwood day in the City of Oakwood. He explained that last Friday, an Oakwood Public Safety officer was on his way to work on his motorcycle and was struck by a vehicle that failed to yield, but thankfully was not seriously injured. Mayor Duncan read a letter aloud from an Oakwood resident and a response letter from City Manager Norbert Klopsch regarding excellent refuse services provided to a residence after a refrigerator/freezer failure.
