

**MINUTES
OAKWOOD CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION
OCTOBER 5, 2009**

The council of the city of Oakwood, Ohio, met in a work session on Monday, October 5, 2009 in the conference room of the Oakwood Municipal Building, 30 Park Avenue. The Mayor of the city, Judy Cook, presided. Council members in attendance were Mayor Judy Cook, Vice Mayor Carlo McGinnis, Steven Byington, William Duncan and Stanley Castleman; Staff in attendance were City Manager Norbert Klopsch and City Attorney Dalma Grandjean.

Mayor Cook called the pre-council meeting to order at 6 p.m. and led a discussion on the following agenda items:

- **STATUS REPORTS:** Council discussed the following three reports planned for the formal meeting.
 - SUGAR CAMP/POINTE OAKWOOD, MR. BYINGTON
 - PROCLAMATION BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH, MAYOR COOK
 - MVRPC GOING PLACES COMMUNITY WORKSHOPS, MR. MCGINNIS

- **VISITORS:** Mr. Byington asked for an explanation of what is expected regarding the tethering presentation. Mayor Cook responded that some folks are interested in seeing restrictions regarding dog tethering included in the city General Offenses code.

- **LEGISLATION:** Mr. Duncan acknowledged that he will introduce the following item at the formal meeting:
 - RESOLUTION ACCEPTING AMOUNTS & RATES AND CERTIFYING TO THE COUNTY AUDITOR, MR. DUNCAN

- **COUNCIL COMMITTEES**
 - PLANNING & ZONING, MR. BYINGTON
 - Routsong Development. Mr. Klopsch provided an update on the status of the development application.
 - PUBLIC PROPERTIES, MR. CASTLEMAN
 - Smith Gardens. Not discussed.
 - Athletic/Rec Master Plan. Mr. Klopsch reviewed work underway on the plan and a recent discussion with a property owner regarding concerns with the cost of any significant athletic/recreation construction projects.

- **REGIONAL AGENCIES**
 - SOUTH SUBURBAN COALITION – UNITED FOR ALCOHOL AND DRUG FREE YOUTH, MR. DUNCAN. Mr. Klopsch commented that the city has paid the \$3,000 dues for the 2009 calendar year.

At 6:25 p.m., Mayor Cook asked for a motion to go to executive session to discuss property matters, labor negotiations and conference with attorney. Motion by Mr. Castleman, second by Mr. Byington. Upon a viva voce vote, motion passed unanimously.
