- Mayor Bill Duncan provided an update on Ohio House Bill 5.

- Ordinance approving Update to the Income Tax Code.
- Resolution endorsing the Learn to Earn Dayton Initiative.
- Ordinance approving the 2014 Budget.

- City Manager Norbert Klopsch gave a presentation on the 2014 city budget.
