

FEBRUARY 3, 2014 COUNCIL MEETING

City Council met in public session on February 3, 2014. Here are the highlights.

STATUS REPORTS

- Mayor Bill Duncan gave the 2014 State of the City Address.
- Mayor Bill Duncan proclaimed March as “Developmental Disabilities Month”.
- Council appointed Nina Anglin to the Personnel Appeals Board and Jill Kollars to the Property Maintenance Board.

Minutes of the January 6, 2014 regular and work sessions of council and January 27, 2014 work session were approved.

LEGISLATION

Oakwood City Council approved the following legislation:

- Ordinance replacing Section 505.121, “Dangerous and Vicious Dogs”.
- Resolution authorizing new Public Works employee labor agreement.
- Resolution supporting regional sustainability and the Dayton Regional Green Initiative.

Oakwood City Council conducted a first reading on the following legislation:

- Ordinance amending Section 148.15, “Credit for Tax Paid to Another Municipality”.

STAFF REPORT

Engineering and Public Works Update. Director Kevin Weaver provided an update on department projects and operations including refuse, 2014 projects, snow removal, water production and the Stormwater Management Program. He also reported on a water main break over the past weekend at E. Thruston Blvd. and Lookout Dr.

- City Manager Norbert Klopsch recognized Kevin Weaver and the Public Works Team for all of their efforts over the past weekend in repairing a major water main break as well as through the inclement weather we have received.

COUNCIL COMMENTS
