Johnny Appleseed Street Tree Project

The Johnny Appleseed Street Tree Project began in 1976 in an effort to support the City of Oakwood's commitment to urban forestry and the environment. To date, this program has been responsible for planting over 2,850 trees. Below are the highlights of the program:

- Cost of the selected species are discounted 50% to Oakwood residents. Trees must be planted in the city right-of-way.
- Species of trees will be 1 3/4" in diameter and are excellent for planting.
- The most needy areas of Oakwood, as determined by the City, will be given first priority.
- One tree will be allocated at the 50% discount for each approved property site.
- Tree specie selections are well suited for planting and most are resistant to disease.
- The tree will be guaranteed for one growing

Applications are available at the Oakwood Community Center during business hours, Monday through Sunday. Once the application has been completed, please return it along with your payment to the Oakwood Community Center or mail the application to the:

Mature Height:	80' - 100'
Rate of Growth:	Fast
Shape:	Vase shape at maturity
Leaves:	Large, glossy green leathery foliage
Fall Color:	Yellow
Flowers:	Yellow, fragrant
Comments:	A true American Elm, tolerant of harsh growing conditions, and an opportunity to replace a lost piece of American History.

Tree Characteristics:

Mature Height:	35' - 45'
Rate of Growth:	Fast
Shape:	Pyramidal
Leaves:	Dark green
Fall Color:	Bright red
Fruit:	Samaras
Flowers:	Insignificant flowers that emerge before leaf set
Comments:	Excellent shade tree for lawn, dense branching and is fast growing.

Tree Characteristics:

Mature Height:	50' - 80'
Rate of Growth:	Slow to medium
Shape:	Upright and oval
Leaves:	Lustrous dark green
Fall Color:	Fluorescent yellow to orange to scarlet to purple
Fruit:	Oblong bluish black drupe, ripening late September
Comments:	One of our most beautiful native trees. Good street tree in residential areas.

Tree Characteristics:

Mature Height: 25’
Rate of Growth: Medium
Shape: Upright and oval
Leaves: Medium to dark green
Fall Color: Faded green to chartreuse brown
Flowers: Creamy white inflorescences in early June
Comments: Virtually disease and pest free ornamental tree.

Tree Characteristics:

Mature Height: Generally over 70’
Rate of Growth: Medium
Shape: Upright and rounded, broadens with age
Leaves: Dark, glossy green
Fall Color: Bright red to dull red
Fruit: Acorns
Comments: An attractive residential tree; no serious disease problems; higher water requirements necessary for establishment.
