

MINUTES
OAKWOOD CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION
FEBRUARY 3, 2014

The council of the city of Oakwood, Ohio, met in a work session on Monday, February 3, 2014 in the conference room of the Oakwood Municipal Building, 30 Park Avenue. The Mayor of the city, William Duncan, presided. Council members in attendance were Mayor William Duncan, Vice Mayor Steve Byington, Rob Stephens and Anne Hilton. Councilmember Stanley Castleman was excused absent. Staff in attendance were City Manager Norbert Klopsch and Law Director Rob Jacques.

Mayor Duncan called the pre-council work session to order at 6:30 p.m. and led a discussion on the following agenda items:

- **STATUS REPORTS:** Mayor Duncan noted that he will deliver his 2014 State of the City Address as the first status report at the formal meeting this evening. Thereafter, he will call for a vote to appoint Jill Kollars to the Property Maintenance Board and Nina Anglin to the Personnel Appeals Board and will read a proclamation designating March as Developmental Disabilities Month. Mayor Duncan also noted that he signed a proclamation recognizing Kinsey Amelia Barhorst as the recipient of an annual LaSertoma Youth Service Award.
- **VISITORS:** Mr. Klopsch noted that there were no scheduled visitors for the formal meeting this evening.
- **LEGISLATION:** Mayor Duncan and Council reviewed the following four items scheduled for the formal meeting this evening:
 - Ordinance replacing Section 505.121, "Dangerous and Vicious Dogs"
 - Ordinance amending Section 148.15, "Credit for Tax Paid to Another Municipality"
 - Resolution authorizing new Public Works employee labor agreement
 - Resolution supporting regional sustainability and the Dayton Regional Green Initiative

Mayor Duncan will introduce the tax credit ordinance, Vice Mayor Byington the regional sustainability resolution and Mr. Stephens the vicious dog ordinance and Public Works resolution.

- **COUNCIL COMMITTEES**
 - **SAFETY & TRAFFIC, Mr. Stephens**
 - **Traffic Enforcement:** Mr. Klopsch briefed Council on traffic enforcement statistics for the Oakwood Public Safety Department. He reviewed annual data from 1988-2013 and discussed the importance of traffic enforcement operations.
 - **MISCELLANEOUS**
 - **Dayton Development Coalition Membership Renewal:** Mr. Klopsch recommended that Oakwood renew its membership to the Coalition at an annual cost of \$5,500. Council concurred.

- UD Breakfast – Tuesday, May 6: Council discussed the May 6 annual breakfast event and possibility of conducting it at Flyboys Deli. Mr. Klopsch will contact the owners to discuss details.
- Mayors Advisory Council: Mayor Duncan briefed Council on a meeting he attended earlier today with about 12 area mayors and US Representative Mike Turner. This was an inaugural meeting of a new group with which Representative Turner plans to meet on a periodic basis. Each of the mayors expressed issues of concern. Most concerns focus on infrastructure maintenance costs and state actions that are hurting local governments in Ohio.

There being no other business, Mayor Duncan adjourned the pre-council work session at 7:24 p.m. at which time Council moved to the formal meeting.
